# Protect the Water of the South Downs National Park

The water of the South Downs is an incredibly valuable natural asset for our region. Not only does the chalk provide filtered drinking water to over a million people across our towns and cities, but the rivers provide a home to important wildlife species and could support many more.

Water quality in the South Downs is showing signs of improvement. We've seen the return of otters to some parts of the National Park and, while there is a healthy population of eels (a favourite food source for otters), there is still some way to go on seeing a full recovery for both of these species.

We've also been working with partners to address the threat to our groundwater. The Aquifer Partnership is bringing together key agencies and landowners to enhance the water quality in the Brighton Chalk block, to ensure it can remain a sustainable resource for public water supply.

To mark World Water Day we're sharing our top six tips of what we can do as individuals to help protect and enhance the water of the South Downs.

- 1. Buy less plastic, and if you must buy it recycle or bin it!
- 2. Save water
- 3. Remember the toilet is not a bin!
- 4. Keep out oils, fat, or grease from the sink
- 5. Reduce chemical use in your garden
- 6. Use your car less

### SHAPING WEST SUSSEX

A local government reorganisation engagement survey is now live at shapingwestsussex.org

Major changes are planned to councils across West Sussex as part of the biggest shake-up of local government in more than 50 years. The Government has asked councils to explore how local government reorganisation could work in the area, with the aim of replacing the current county, district and borough councils with a new unitary council or councils responsible for all local services.

Residents, businesses and community groups across the county are invited to share their views about where they live or work, the council services they use, as well as their thoughts about how their council could be structured in the future. Please make sure that you have your say.

The website also contains lots of background information and FAQs about local government reorganisation and what it means to our area. The survey is open until 11.59pm on Wednesday 13th August.





## Museum announces an extraordinary summer with six weeks of play, imagination and discovery


School's out for summer and the Weald & Downland Living Museum has launched a full six weeks of entertainment and exploration that will captivate children of all ages.





### Hot-Spot Policing: Home Office's Safer Summer Streets

This national campaign includes police, councils, schools, health services, businesses and transport – working together to tackle anti-social behaviour, particularly in town centres during the busy summer period.

In Sussex, our Force will use a strategy known as 'hot spot policing' to gather evidence and tackle crime in specific areas. Hot spots are identified areas with persistently high levels of crime or disorder. Every county has hot spots and, quite often, they're in high footfall areas, like town centres but they can also include specific buildings, certain roads or even particular addresses.

Hot spot policing involves using an increased, frequent, visible policing presence, because evidence shows this not only deters criminals but also minimises the crime opportunities for offenders.

Our partners (listed above) also have a key role to play in ensuring safety this summer, with involvement in projects such as improved lighting, public engagement and working with police to manage large-scale summer events.

I look forward to seeing more positive results from our Force and partners throughout the summer months and hearing how the campaign is landing in other parts of the country.

The Wayfinding Advice Bus has been designed to bring the charity's unique Wayfinding service to local communities, through a mobile consultation room offering private dementia advice appointments and drop-ins. Sage House's free of charge Wayfinding service provides both practical advice and emotional support to make sense of the journey ahead. Their team of Wayfinders provide appointments and follow-up support in-person or over the phone. Families speak to the same Wayfinder every time - providing a familiar voice from someone who understands their specific needs.

Wayfinding Advice Bus - increasing

Purchase and conversion of the vehicle was entirely funded through grants from SGN, Clothworkers Foundation and the Friends of Midhurst Community Hospital, enabling the launch of this new service. Alongside attending the charity's six Outreach venues across the two districts, the Wayfinding team will be popping up at different locations across the county, including GP Surgeries, Village Fairs, Cafes and other community venues locally. From September, the ambassadors who are aged 13-18 will be in place in their school or college to deliver sessions to other students to help protect them from dangers they might encounter online.

# Blasts From the Past

At this time of year, we are finding that a lot of our patients are dehydrated upon arrival, on top of whatever the main cause for admission may be. **Please remember to refill bird baths** and leave out low dishes of fresh water on the ground during the day and the nighttime to help all species of local wildlife during these incredibly hot months.

It is important to be aware that there is very worryingly a rise in cases of **animal cruelty** against wildlife in the local area, mainly with the use of **slingshots and catapults**, which is not only utterly barbaric, but wholly illegal too. Please report any suspicions, sightings or discovered victims of this to 101, as the police cannot act with any reports made via social media. Please also bring us any victims still alive as soon as possible and we will do our utmost to help these poor precious creatures. Thank you.

At Droke, we are gearing up for the start of our calving season beginning in August with 240 cows due to calve over a 12 week period so "all hands to the pump" as they say.

Summertime brings sheep shearers back onto our farms which will be a great relief for the ewes in this hot weather. Although grass is slow growing this year, the lambs are growing well and benefitting from the warm sunshine.

At Ides Barn, close to the Milk Hut, we have recently installed a Padel Court in our old grain store as a form of farm diversification.
