# WATER CRISIS LOOMS

England's Looming Water Crisis: A Call for Urgent Action: England faces a critical water shortage by 2055, with a projected daily deficit of six billion litres if drastic measures aren't taken. The Environment Agency (EA) warns that without "continued and sustained effort" to reduce demand, future economic growth could be compromised.

According to the EA's five-yearly National Framework for Water Resources report, actions are needed across the board. This includes more frequent hosepipe bans during droughts to highlight water scarcity, the wider implementation of 'smart' water meters and a reduction in average daily individual water use from 140 litres to 110 litres per person.

Key drivers of the deficit are a growing population, expected to increase by eight million by 2055, and climate change, leading to hotter, drier summers and impacting river ecosystems through over-abstraction.

Solutions also involve water companies drastically cutting leaks from pipes by half by 2050 and investing in new infrastructure like reservoirs, desalination plants, and a "water grid" to transfer supplies. However, these large-scale projects won't be fully operational for decades, meaning initial efforts must heavily rely on reduced customer demand. # PRISONERS TO BUILD NEW HOMES IN SUSSEX

A cross-government programme that will see prisoners in Sussex build new homes within the county. The affordable homes are high-quality, lowcarbon, eco-friendly and sustainable and will be offered to people on the



local authority housing register, key workers or vulnerable people such as women and children who are fleeing domestic abuse.

Ford Prison inmates are being given the opportunity to apply for jobs building the homes, employed and supported by established housing providers in the county. Through supervision and training, prisoners will be given the chance to learn new skills, increase their chances of long-term work and turn their lives around, thus reducing the cycle of re-offending.



In an emergency you will find these defibrillators locally at Singleton Village Hall (Po18 oHA), the Phone Box at Charlton (Foxhall Lane, PO18 oHX), behind East Dean

Village Hall (PO18 oJG) and on the front of West Dean Stores.

Once activated, the device will talk you through how to use it. A defibrillator is a device that gives a high energy shock to the heart of someone who is in cardiac arrest.

As I write this article, we are mowing our crop of lucerne or alfalfa in East Dean for the second time this season (see photo). This will be left to wilt for 24 hours and then picked up by forage harvester and clamped for winter silage.

Lucerne loves the sunshine and because of its deep roots can extract moisture from deep down even in drought conditions. As I explained last month our cows are now coming to the end of their lactation and our daily milk



production is shrinking but still more than sufficient to keep the vending machine supplied. I notice that as the milk yield drops the butterfat and protein in the milk rises, so is even more healthy and good to taste. Our other crops of wheat, barley, peas and beans are all full of promise as we look forward to harvest which I think will begin a little earlier this year.

At Goodwood we welcomed nearly 2000 visitors to Home Farm on 'Open Farm Sunday'. This was a fantastic opportunity to demonstrate to the public how some of our food is produced. We were blessed with amazing weather, and we are grateful to all who came and especially our dedicated farm and educational team, including our vet and nutritionist who ferried, guided and answered their many questions. Here at East Dean, it was our pleasure to invite the local WI for a tractor/trailer ride round the farm finishing up with a sundowner on top of Oxen Down on a splendid summer evening looking out across the valley.

# **Tackling Organised Waste Crime**

'Waste crime' is a broad term covering anything from fly-tipping to largescale commercial waste disposal. These activities are illegal, hazardous to our environment, extremely costly to clear up and by no means victimless.

In 2023/24, over 100,000 cases of fly-tipping occurred in the South East with

49,000 of these on highways, 28,000 on public land and 3,000 on private land. Many of these crimes are carried out by organised crime gangs who use tipper lorries and large vans. Whilst it is the responsibility of local authorities and the Environment Agency to investigate, clear and enforce the law on these matters, it is vital that police forces are sighted and give full support to operations that involve catching these brazen criminals. Using technology to take down these gangs can be an option. We know that many people use video doorbells so if people catch illegal waste crime on their cameras.


Discussions with partners including the National Farmers Union, The Country





# Elaine Kelly 1946 – 2025

When we think of Elaine Kelly the first thing most of us remember is what a great job her and Chris made of running West Dean Stores. But the story of how they got there could easily take up a whole magazine, so this can only be a summary of the life of a remarkable woman.

Elaine was born in Winchester on the 23rd December 1946 to Robert and Dorothy Oswald. Her father was an officer in the RAF, so her early years were spent moving between various overseas postings including Singapore and Greece, which the family drove home from right across Europe in an elderly Vauxhall. It wasn't to be the last time that Elaine took a road trip around Europe.

By 1953 Robert had risen to the rank of Wing Commander and was stationed in East Anglia when he was awarded the O.B.E. for his actions in response to the catastrophic flooding that hit much of the East Coast on the night of 1st February that year. After her father finished his military service the family moved to a village near Coventry, and it was while working in the linens department of Owen & Owen's she met Chris Kelly, who was in soft furnishings. For their first date they went ten-pin bowling!

They moved on to work at Coventry Theatre, Chris backstage with Elaine it the booking office, and were married on the 5th November 1966 with all the theatre crew making for a very lively reception! They were living in a mobile home in Twigworth (Gloucestershire) when their son Stephen was born, but since this was not the ideal environment to raise a baby in, Elaine went to her parents who by this time were running a Post Office in Brighton. Chris had to stay in Gloucestershire to finish a contract, but as soon as he was able to join her they bought a house in the next street and their daughter Annette was born.

Chris then got a job working for Airworks Services which entailed a two year contract in Saudi Arabia for the Royal Saudi Airforce. Elaine, Stephen and Annette flew out for the last six months, but they both felt they wanted the children to grow up in Britain so moved back to Brighton, with Elaine taking an increasing role in running the Post Office whilst Chris took a job working for a business transfer agents. Business transfer involves calculating the worth of all the stock in a shop, to deduce the exact value of the business. In those pre-barcode days stock taking meant literally counting every item in a shop, but the experience he gained, combined with Elaine's work in the Post Office, set them up for what they did next.

When Chris and Elaine took over Nutbourne Post Office Stores it could not be described as thriving: the total value of the stock was £38! By the time they left it they'd added newspapers and an off-licence section and released the potential that they knew it had in it. The Great Storm of 1987 was a bit of a setback; they lost their conservatory and half the roof, but of course they didn't close and once the insurance was settled the place was back up together and better than ever. So having created a community hub in Nutbourne, the following year they decided to take on a fresh challenge, and that was West Dean Stores.

At West Dean they repeated the approach that had worked so well in Nutbourne, adding beer wine and spirits to the shelves as well as greatly increasing the range of everyday items that people find themselves needing. Most importantly they instigated a newspaper delivery service, which gradually expanded to cover East Dean and Singleton as the shops there closed down. Paper deliveries are hard work; you have to be up at 5.00 am to take them in and sort them into order ready to go out so people get the right one before they go to work then, when you've already been at work for four hours, the customers who've only just got up start coming in for loaves and milk and apples and baked beans and shoelaces and 13 amp fuse wire and pork pies and first class stamps and West Dean Stores had all of that and a whole lot more when the Kelly's ran it!

Elaine suffered a health crisis in 2000 when she developed thyroid cancer. It was treated successfully, and they carried on at West Dean until 2007, when they decided to retire while they still had their health.

Of course Elaine didn't retire, in the sense of just quietly pottering around the garden. She was Treasurer of the



Valley Gardening Club, an active member of the W.I., on the Singleton Village Hall committee as well as being a qualified dog trainer, working part time for Oving Dog Training. Both her and Chris were heavily involved as volunteers at the Weald and Downland Living Museum, and when they weren't doing that, in an echo of that childhood drive across Europe (and their early life in a mobile home) she and Chris took to spending three months every winter caravanning around on The Continent. The last such trip came to a sudden end in 2020: they were in Spain when Covid 19 struck and were forced to come home, not helped by the Spanish authorities ordering all foreign travellers to leave, but then shutting the borders to make it hard for them to do so! The French weren't particularly helpful either.

Last September Elaine and Chris took what was to be their last trip together, to Bourton on the Water in the Cotswolds. It was whilst there she first noticed difficulty walking which turned out to be a caused by a brain tumour. Although she initially responded well to treatment she unfortunately contracted pneumonia in hospital, which set her back significantly. Eventually discharged she was glad to get home, although frustrated by her inability to get up and get on with things as she had done all her life. A further bout of pneumonia took her back into hospital, where she died on Friday 6th of June. Chris was holding her hand as she passed. As well as her children she leaves three grandchildren, Tasmin, Meghan and Lauren.

There will be a celebration of her life at Singleton Village Hall at 2pm on Friday 25th July and everyone who knew and loved Elaine is welcome to come along. We may need a bigger hall! *Tim Weeks*







funding from South Downs National Park to enable me to offer schools a free visit to learn about how we produce organic milk, keeping our animals healthy and safe.




